Course aims

The aim of the course is for the students to grasp the complex spatial relations between man, society and nature. Theoretical - methodological basis of traditional and modern anthropogeography, Jovan Cvijić and the Serbian school of anthropogeography, Physical anthropogeography, Economic and cultural basis of human geography, Social and political basis of human geography.

Practical part

Field research methods in anthropogeography. Forms of indoor work in anthropogeography. Working on teaching topics through specific tasks (mostly through examples related to Serbia). Calculation of certain indicators, drawing graphical representations, analysis and interpretation of data. The focus is on the professional and methodological-didactic application of graphic and other methods in anthropogeography.
