Political-geographical structure of the state (Fundamentals of geographical theory of the state, Territory and power of the state, Territorial sovereignty of the state, State territory (types), Geographical position of the state (types), State borders, The center and the capital of the state, Anthropogeographical determinants of the state (Population and state, Cultural space and state, Religion and state), Economic structure of the state, Types of states according to socio-political organization (Types of political systems on the political map of the world, Administrative division and territorial cohesion of the state, Electoral systems (electoral geography), Political-geographical map of the world (Formation of a political map of the world by continents), New World Order, Formation of a global geopolitical system, Subjects of the New World Order, International Associations and Organizations, Geopolitical position of Serbia (Determinants of the geopolitical position of Serbia in Southeast Europe and the Balkans, Changes in the geopolitical position of Serbia in the past and today, political-geographical and geopolitical processes important for Serbia).
